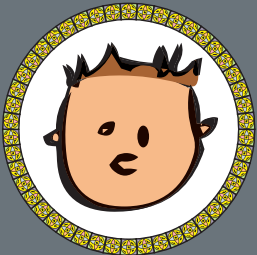
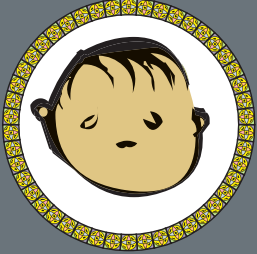
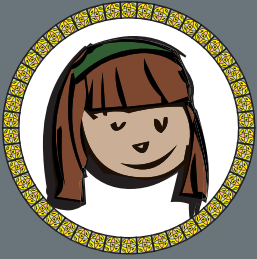


Learning Disabilities Association of Niagara Region
