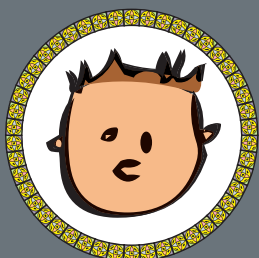
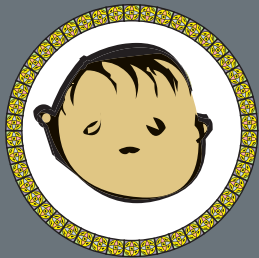
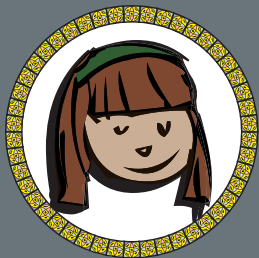


# Learning Disabilities Association of Peterborough



The Learning Disabilities Association of Peterborough (LDAP) is a multi- community agency serving the City and County of Peterborough, Northumberland County, Clarington Municipality and the City of Kawartha Lakes Region.

LDAP strives to serve and support the members of our communities with learning disabilities (LDs) and/or Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder (ADHD), while educating and nurturing understanding by the general population, through the organization's many and varied services and programs.

## Our services include:

- **Parent Education seminars/workshops** – these are offered throughout the year on a variety of topics
- **Resource Facilitation** – our Resource Facilitators can help make sense of issues relating to LDs and ADHD for parents, teachers, doctors etc.
- **Advocacy Training for Parents** – parents learn how to advocate on behalf of their children by learning their rights and responsibilities
- **Some Assembly Required Program** – SoAR targets students with LDs making the transition from elementary to high school giving them skills related to self-awareness, the changes that come with high school, organization, etc.
- **Stay In School Program** – For high school students struggling with academic, personal and/or social difficulties. We provide an alternate learning environment with one to one tutoring support to work towards academic credit achievement, self advocacy skills and fostering recognition of academic potential and personal goals
- **Community Access Program (CAP)** - Computer access to community members wishing to develop skills utilizing the internet, e-mail communications and the use of adaptive technology
- **Computers for Literacy Development Program** – A one-to-one tutoring program helping students from Kindergarten to Grade 12 improve their reading, writing and numeracy skills
- **Job Fit** – A comprehensive employment program designed to address the needs and challenges of unemployed adults with suspected learning disabilities and/or ADHD
- **Resource Library** –containing a choice of books, videos, journals and articles about LDs and ADHD that are available for loan
