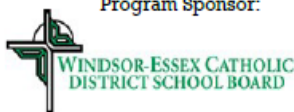

SOAR Transition Planning Program

SOAR is for youth 13-15 years of age with LD/ADHD who are about to or have recently started high school.

Topics discussed include: how people learn, how a learning disability interferes with learning, how to break down school work into areas and how to approach each of these areas, preparing for the changes and choices that will come in high school, and discussion is held regarding IEPs and accommodations. Each participant will get their own workbooks to record their work. Many of the concepts taught will be reinforced with games and hands-on activities, with incentives being provided to promote participation.

The program will be held at the LDAWE office on Wednesdays from 9:30am - 12:30pm beginning Wednesday, July 16, 2014. The program cost is \$175 for non-LDA members or \$125 for LDA members per 6-week session. Subsidies may be available.

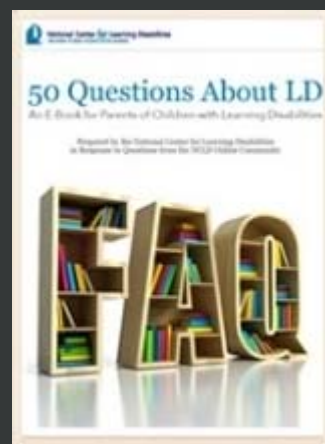
