This is a practical program with specific courses related to the development of learning strategies and applications in addition to utilizing assistive technology designed to support learners with specific learning disabilities.

This program will attract educators and educational assistants at all levels who will benefit from an increased understanding of learners with learning disabilities and by advancing their knowledge of applied learning strategies and assistive technologies. In the postsecondary field, professors, learning strategists, assistive technologists and other staff will build on their existing knowledge and develop skills specific to working with students with learning disabilities
