Individual Education Plans (IEP): 2011-2012 Internal Review

Effective Individual Education Plans (IEPs) are an important tool to support the success of students with special education needs. Results of recent consultations held by the Ministry on IEPs have shown that most district school boards are conducting their own internal IEP reviews and have indicated a preference to continue with this practice. The Ministry builds upon this practice as a basis for the 2011-2012 internal IEP review.

School boards, school authorities and provincial/demonstrations schools will conduct an internal review of IEPs. The purpose of this review is to assess the progress made since the 2006-2007 Collaborative IEP Review in adopting the key elements of the 2000 IEP Standards. The Ministry is also asking boards to share effective practices that have contributed to their progress as well as any future activities planned to promote continuous improvement.

School boards, school authorities and provincial/demonstration schools are being asked to establish an Internal IEP review team and designate an IEP team lead. The internal IEP team could be comprised of a supervisory officer responsible for special education, a system program lead for IEPs (coordinator, system principal, consultant), a school principal (elementary or secondary), a teacher, a representative from the Special Education Advisory Committee and a parent and/or student representative. It is recommended that one person from the school board, school authority and provincial and/or demonstration school be designated as the IEP review lead. This individual should review all material prior to the team being established, and will be responsible for completing the "Internal Individual Education Plan Review Report: 2011- 2012" and submitting it electronically.

A Webinar is posted on e-Community Ontario to guide the IEP team with overview material and the methodology to conduct the internal IEP review. Teleconferences will be organized by staff from the Special Education Policy and Programs Branch in collaboration with the Regional Offices to answer any questions IEP team leads may have after reviewing the Webinar and the internal review IEP material (participation is optional based on board needs).

After conducting their internal IEP review, IEP team leads are asked to transmit the results of the internal review to the Ministry by completing a survey by June 29th, 2012.

The Ministry will produce and release a provincial trends report based on the results submitted by school boards, school authorities and provincial and demonstration schools. The results will inform next steps.
