This is to advise you that you continue to be required to ensure that a comprehensive report is made publicly available regarding the current special education programs and services available to meet the needs of the students in your board.

A current and comprehensive Special Education Report would include the components that are defined in *Standards for School Boards' Special Education Plans (2000)* as well as the protocols established in PPM 149.

School boards will need to review the report prepared for 2010-11 and update it by making any necessary additions and/or amendments to relevant sections. In preparing or updating this report, school boards and school authorities must continue to consult with their respective Special Education Advisory Committees (SEAC) as per *Regulation 464/97*.

Each school board must ensure that this information is made available to all members of the board community by the start of each school year. Most school boards and some School Authorities made their 2010 Special Education Reports publicly available by posting them on their public websites.

In order that the Ministry is kept informed about current special education programs and services and any amendments made to your Special Education Report, you are also required to provide the electronic link to the report on your board website. If your school board report is not available on your board website, an electronic file of the report or a paper copy must be submitted to the Ministry.

Please complete the attached 2011 Special Education Report Checklist (Appendix A) to identify:

- components of your board's special education report that include amended information in regards to the special education programs and services that will be available for 2011-12
- addition of new information required on PPM 149

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• the method (electronic link to report on board website, electronic file, paper copy) used to provide Ministry and public access to the report.

Please submit a copy of the completed checklist including board website link, electronic file or paper copy to your regional office by September 1, 2011.

As you are aware, special education planning is also included in the board improvement planning process focussed on improving student achievement. As the achievement of students with special education needs is considered in the development, implementation and monitoring of the Board Improvement Plans for Student Achievement, you are encouraged to continue consulting with your SEAC regarding these processes.

Any questions in regard to the Special Education Reports should be directed to the Special Education Lead in your region.
